Santa will be on site from noon to 2:00 pm for photos.

In addition to the Holiday Fiesta, the museum's permanent collection and special exhibits will be on view during the event. The museum's current special exhibits include *Picturing Home: Plants and Animals of the Southwest, Corn: Sacred Giver of Life, Feast Days: A Cycle of Faith, La Familia: Legendary Families and the Legacy of the Millicent Rogers Museum,* and *To Honor Millicent.* For visitors looking to start their holiday shopping, the Museum Store will feature a variety of unique Southwest gifts, such as Pueblo nativity sets, handmade ornaments, Christmas earrings, holiday cards, and 2018 calendars. The Millicent Rogers Museum is open from 10-5 (MST) Tuesday through Sunday from November to March, and is open every day from April to October.
